



## Training session # 2 in Le Mans

# “Collecting practices, collections and collectors in the modern sciences (18th – 21th C.)”

- The second SciCoMove training session is intended for early-stage researchers who are part of the project.
- It is organized in 5 units, dealing with the topic of collecting practices and collectors.
  - **Unit 1** gives an introduction. It presents the basic bibliography, and deals with the emergence of the “field”, the contrast between field and lab, the role of instruments and instructions, the opposition and collaboration between professional and amateur scientists.
  - **Unit 2** focuses on collecting practices during scientific travels, and on the management of collections at home.
  - **Unit 3** is dedicated to field work in relation with collecting and collections. It focuses on the case of paleontology and prehistoric archaeology.
  - **Unit 4** deals with collectors, their networks and the role of women.
  - **Unit 5** focuses on the role of instruments used in collecting, through the example of anatomy and physical anthropology.
- A visit of Le Mans Museums, a presentation of the ongoing reorganization and a discussion with the curators is planned.
- During the week, participants will also work in small groups on case studies related to the topic of the training session. They will prepare a short video to present the result of the research carried out within the groups. These videos will be presented and discussed by the teaching team on the last day.
- The classes and collective work will be in English.
